

## What is a PID?

A persistent identifier (PID) is a long-lasting digital reference to, e.g., a digital object, person/author/contributor, webpage, or organization.

## What does a PID do?

PIDs ensure the findability and interoperability of a digital resource (as in the FAIR Principles).

In contrast to a URL that can break or rot, a PID will always point to the right object, even when the location changes.

PIDs also certify the identity of the digital object, contributor, or organization.
