Austrian Library Congress

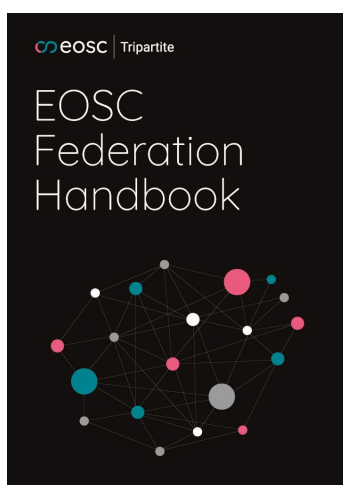

Skills4EOSC Webinar

In addition to an Open Science overview, the session focused on training materials, FAIR data initiatives, and the strategic development of national research infrastructures.
